Recognized Qualification by Hong Kong Psychological Society (HKPS)

Eligible to be:

- Member of Division of Counselling Psychology (DCoP)
- "Registered Counselling Psychologist"
 (after one year of post-qualification experience)

NOTE: To register as Registered Counselling Psychologist in Hong Kong, graduate membership of Hong Kong Psychological Society (HKPS) is required.

The Hong Kong Psychological Society (HKPS)

Graduate Members - To qualify for election as a Graduate member, a candidate shall have satisfied the Council one of the following conditions:

- (i) a bachelor degree from an institution recognized by the Council at a minimum lower 2nd class honours level or a GPA of 3.0 out of 4.0 or equivalent with psychology as the major subject taking no less than 8 courses in different areas of psychology covering at least Research Methods in Psychology and 4 out of the 6 following fundamental areas: Biological / Physiological Psychology, Developmental /Child Psychology, Cognitive Psychology /Perception /Learning /Memory, Personality /Individual Differences, Social Psychology, and History of Psychology/Contemporary Issues in Psychology; or
- (ii) a postgraduate qualification in psychology from an institution recognized by the Council covering the courses and fundamental areas of psychology as specified in (i) above; or
- (iii) such other qualification in psychology as the Council shall approve.

Entrance Requirements

Programme Entrance Requirements

(Adhering to HKPS requirements)

Basic Requirements:

Applicants for admission to the Master of Social Sciences in Counselling Psychology programme **MUST** either

1. be in possession of a <u>Bachelor's degree with first or second</u> <u>class honours in Psychology</u> from a recognized local or overseas university

OR

2. be in possession of a <u>Bachelor's degree with first or second</u> <u>class honours</u> in fields other than Psychology, AND have completed a <u>post-graduate conversion programme</u> in Psychology (e.g. <u>Master of Social Sciences in Psychology</u>, etc).



Specific Requirements:

Successful applicants who meet the general requirements stated above are conditionally admitted into the programme, subject to completion of an introductory course in Counselling Psychology offered between end of May and early July.

Language Requirements:

As the primary language of instruction in the programme is English, applicants whose entrance qualification is issued by an institution where the medium of instruction is not English should also fulfil the following minimum English proficiency requirement:

- 1) Overall score ≥ 6.5 in International English Language Testing System (IELTS) (academic); or
- 2) Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) score of 600 (paper -based test) or 100 (internet-based test) or 250 (computer-based test); or
- 3) Other equivalent qualifications that are acceptable to the university, including degrees from a recognised English medium institution in good standing.

Application Stages (Important Deadlines)

Interviews:

After initial screening, applicants will participate in:

- 1) Individual Interview
 - Interviewing with two of the master's faculty members
- 2) English writing sample

Process Stages

1	1 March 2025	Application Deadline (Transcripts, 2 Referee Reports, Language Proficiency, Photograph & Autobiography)
2	22 March 2025	Interview Day (English Writing Sample and Individual Interview)
3	Late April to Early May 2025	Decision Announcement
