Well-rounded Curriculum


Offers modules covering knowledge on adversity and trauma, assessment techniques, and evidence-based management strategies with cross-cultural considerations.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS



- Obtained a Bachelor's degree in psychology, social sciences, education, nursing, medical science or other related areas;
- IELTS 6.0 or above (Academic) / TOEFL 80 or above (Internet-based), or equivalent English qualification. Exemption may be granted to applicants with degrees awarded by institutions where the medium of instruction and assessment is English;
- Demonstrated Chinese oral and written proficiency and IT literacy;
- Passed the individual admission interview
