





STRUCTURE OF CLINICAL PRACTICE (AKA EXTERNSHIP)

- PsyD-CoP Clinical Practice is an essential dynamic training process from which a reflective,
 competent, and ethical scientist-practitioner emerges.
- A) Supervised Clinical Work
- B) Supervised Clinical Supervision Work
- C) Regular Clinical Supervision from University Clinical Supervisors
- D) Onsite Duty Work
- A minimum of 2 full working days (16 hours) each week at the designated agency

STRUCTURE OF CLINICAL PRACTICE (AKA EXTERNSHIP)

■ Students admitted to the PsyD programme without a master's degree recognized by DCoP of HKPS are required to take extra Clinical Practice and master's level Clinical Practicum/Seminar courses in order to meet DCoP membership requirement (i.e., a minimum of 1000 supervised practicum hours and 200 clinical supervision hours)

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must:

- 1. Possess a <u>Bachelor's degree (honours)</u> or a postgraduate conversion degree in Psychology from a recognized local or overseas university;
- 2. Possess a <u>Master's degree</u> in Counselling Psychology#, Clinical Psychology# or Counselling* from a recognized local or overseas university;
- 3. Have earned a <u>GPA of 3.3 or above</u>, or its equivalent, from the aforementioned programmes of study; and
- 4. EITHER

Be currently <u>registered or be eligible to register</u> with the <u>Hong Kong Psychological Society</u> (HKPS) as a Counselling or Clinical Psychologist;

OR

Have completed <u>at least one year</u> of supervised post qualification experience in counselling practice after obtaining the master's degree in Counselling.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Applicants with a master's degree recognized by the Division of Counselling Psychology (DCoP) of HKPS will be required to complete 60 credits before graduation.

* Applicants without a master's degree recognized by the Division of Counselling Psychology (DCoP) of HKPS will be required to complete the following courses to fulfil the membership requirement of DCoP: a) CP615 Clinical Practice IV b) Three courses (a total of 9 credits) at Master's level offered by the University related to assessment, psychotherapy and counselling psychology practice (i.e., CP519 Assessment & Evaluation for Counselling Psychology I, CP522 Professional Practice and Ethical Issues in Counselling Psychology, and one Clinical Practicum/Seminar course). Students are required to pay the additional credit fees. The courses required will be decided on a case-by-case basis. The maximum number of credits required is 75.

MODE OF STUDY & TUITION FEE

PART TIME; 3 YEARS HK\$3,500 FOR ONE CREDIT

DOCTORAL STUDENTSHIPS

Limited offer of PsyD-CoP Studentships to outstanding applicants each year.

Each studentship is HKD90,000 per academic year, paid at the rate of HKD15,000 per month for two 3-month semesters.

Students awarded with studentships are expected to assist in **research and teaching activities** at the Bachelor's or Master's level assigned by the Programme Director

Year 1: Applicants must indicate clearly their intention to apply for studentships on their application forms.

Year 2: Studentships are open for applications in early July of the year.
